Further to our acknowledgement, we can confirm that Oxford City Council can advise as follows in response to your Freedom of Information Request received on 25 October:

Request

1. The average length of time households spent in temporary accommodation (including b&bs and hotels) after making a homelessness application to the council (NB: The average time for households whose temporary accommodation finished within these time periods so won't include recently made applications within time period.)

a). between April 1st 2023 and March 31st 2024

149 days.

b). between April 1st 2024 and September 30th 2024

180 days.

The average length of time households with children spent in temporary accommodation (including b&b and hotels) after making a homelessness application to the council:

a). between April 1st 2023 and March 31st 2024

186 days.

b). between April 1st 2024 and September 30th 2024

196 days.

If you disagree with any part of the response to your request, you are entitled to ask the Council for an internal review of the decision(s) made.
