Question 1. Do you currently use nightly paid temporary accommodation?

Question 2. How much do you pay for nightly based temporary accommodation on the following size properties;

Price for nightly paid provision is not subject to property size. the council currently use multiple suppliers to provide nightly paid accommodation. This will usually be a hotel or bed and breakfast. rates vary from providers ranging from £50 to £150 per night.

Question 3. How many units of nightly based temporary accommodation do you currently use?

We currently have 111 nightly paid accounts active.

Question 4. How many singles and families do you current have in a hotel or B&B?

15 - Households with children.

93 - Single households.

3 - Not a single household and does not have children.

Question 5. How many of those singles or families have been in the hotel or B&B accommodation for more than 54 days?

76.

Question 6. Is your temporary accommodation via a tender or fixed contract currently?
